Competitive drills and evolutions by those in attendance.

The groups will organize into teams and perform the following drills and evolutions. Not more than six men in any of the exercises.

I. Raise 50 foot Bangor ladder to 4th floor; carry line of hose through window with 50 feet of hose inside and with nozzle at a window; show water; secure lines.

II. Attach line to hydrant, nozzle to hose; carry up stairs to fourth floor and show water at window; secure lines.

III. Hoist hose with hand line to fourth floor, show water; secure lines.

IV. Rescue man from third floor using life line or ladder.

AWARDS

2 Akron small line shut-off nozzles with 1/2-inch tips.

1 Akron ball type quick-acting shut-off Siamese, 2 1/2 x 1 1/2 x 1 1/2.

NOTES

The Twin Cities, Champaign and Urbana, are the home of the University of Illinois. The Illinois Central, Wabash, Big Four, and the Illinois Traction System enter Champaign and the Wabash, Big Four and Illinois Traction enter Urbana.
