

# WATCH THE CHINCH-BUG!

## Serve Your Country BY SAVING YOUR CROPS



The chinch-bug in its various stages: *a*, the adult, or the fifth stage; *b*, the egg; *c*, the first stage; *d*, the second stage; *e*, the third stage; *f*, the fourth stage; *g*, an infested wheat plant, showing eggs and young.

Chinch-bugs are present in numbers to cause serious damage in some fields in this vicinity this year. Examine *your* wheat fields and see if the bugs are present there.

They can be successfully and cheaply controlled by the use of barriers of creosote, with post-hole traps, around wheat fields at harvest time. The best results can be obtained only by the co-operation of all the farmers of a community.
