Law Library

WE ARE PRIVILEGED to publish the catalog of this distinguished collection. The following description has been provided by the library:

The teaching of law at Columbia really began when James Kent was appointed professor of law in Columbia College in December, 1793, although a professorship of law had been established in 1773. The first catalog of law books was a handwritten catalog in 1874. Apparently the law books were included in the card catalog of all books at Columbia until the Law School moved to its separate quarters in Kent Hall in 1910, when the card catalog of the Law Library was established. The Law Library consisted of about 30,000 volumes in 1904; today it contains about 465,000 volumes, making it the third largest law library in the country.

The library is especially rich in legal literature of the United States and the British Commonwealth of Nations, including English Yearbooks, abridgments, and various editions of Blackstone's Commentaries (including the first) and in documents and treatises on international law. It contains a large collection of foreign law, with excellent coverage of Roman and medieval law. The collections of legal literature of France, Germany, Austria, Italy and Spain are as extensive as those found in most of the libraries of those countries. The materials on African law are abundant, and include gazettes of the newly independent countries. In addition, the library is one of the few in America containing a complete set of the laws and decisions of the Russian Imperial and Provisional governments, and those of the Soviet government which are available.

Among the collection's treasures are volumes from the libraries of the first president of King's College, Dr. Samuel Johnson, and of the first president of Columbia College, Dr. William Samuel Johnson; the law books contained in the Murray gift which was presented to King's College in 1757; and the law books originally in the libraries of John Jay and Chancellor Kent.

The card catalog is a dictionary arrangement embracing authors, subjects and distinctive titles, and includes a semi-classed catalog of all foreign law material. It contains about seven hundred periodicals and many other serial publications. Quite a few serials are analyzed, including most of the publications of the Department of State and many of the United Nations and its agencies, and regional bodies such as the Organization of American States. An amplification of the Library of Congress JX scheme has been worked out for Common Markets, with a semi-classed subject breakdown based on the Treaty of Rome.

The approximately 690,000 cards in this catalog have been reproduced by offset with approximately 31 cards per 10" x 14" page. The 28 volumes are bound in Class A library binding. Supplements to this catalog are planned.
