**LIBRARY TECHNOLOGY REPORTS:**

Numerous repairs and adjustments were required during the initial tests. On a test sample from later production, guide wires in the receiving bin were adjusted to prevent copies from backing up and falling out of the bin. The problem was not completely eliminated, even with adjustment.

Frequent jamming was a problem both in the tests and in user experience. The jams are easily cleared by a trained operator, but unless a trained operator is available excessive downtime is likely.

# W. H. Auden

## A Bibliography, 1924-1969

By B. C. BLOOMFIELD, *University of London*, and EDWARD MENDELSON, *Yale University*.  
xvi, 420 pp., frontis., apps., index. \$20.00  
(Bibliographical Society)

In the first edition of this bibliography of his works Auden inquired, "Is it possible that I have written so *much?*" This second edition not only amplifies information given in the first by adding reprint and sales figures when available but also adds new entries for the years from 1924 through 1969. The bibliography is arranged in sections. The first lists books and pamphlets by Auden. The next section includes works that Auden edited, contributed to, or translated. Other sections, greatly expanded since the first edition, list other writing by Auden, including film scripts, recordings, broadcasts, manuscripts, and unpublished plays, and translations of his works. A comprehensive list of books and essays about Auden and a complete index are also included.

This latest volume of the *Studies* once again collects a wide variety of scholarly articles and a Checklist of Bibliographical Scholarship for 1971. Topics range from establishing the original composition of Marlowe's *Doctor Faustus*, to the use of calligraphy to determine precise dates, and a discussion of periodical literature of English and American bibliography.

## Anthrophysical Form

### Two Families and Their Neighborhood Environments

By ROBERT L. VICKERY, JR., *University of Virginia*. xii, 81 pp., illus., maps, diagrams. \$9.75

The desire to save our cities has made architect-planners aware of the need to determine what constitutes a good or aesthetically pleasing environment. The anthropophysical approach, outlined and used in this study, is a fresh method of dealing with this problem. Two families are studied in relation to their widely contrasting environments and in comparison to each other. One lives in an upper-middle class, private-street neighborhood in St. Louis, Missouri. The other lives in the small village of Vastrapur, near Ahmedabad, India. By concentrating on the daily activities of one typical family in each place, Vickery has been able to determine which elements of form are most important to each neighborhood environment. This study is important not only for its specific information about the two families and their neighborhoods but also for creating an approach that architects, planners, sociologists, and anthropologists can use for future research.
