Instructions for authors: Manuscripts are to be typewritten, double-spaced, and submitted in two copies. The title, name, and affiliation of the author and an abstract of 75 to 100 words should precede the text. Bibliographical references are to be consecutively numbered throughout the manuscript and typewritten, double-spaced, on a separate sheet or sheets at the end. The journal follows *A Manual of Style*, 12th ed., rev. (Chicago: Univ. of Chicago Pr., 1969), in matters of bibliographical style. Authors may consult recent issues of the journal for examples of the style. Further information on submission of manuscripts is included in a statement in *College & Research Libraries News* 39:86–87 (April 1978).

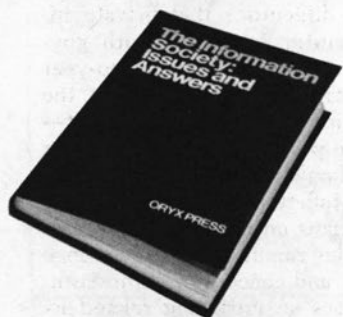
