The journal follows *A Manual of Style*, 12th ed., rev. (Chicago: Univ. of Chicago Pr., 1969), in matters of bibliographical style. Authors may consult recent issues of the journal for examples of the style. Further information on submission of manuscripts is included in a statement in *College & Research Libraries* 41:67-68 (Jan. 1980).
