RACHAEL K. ANDERSON is Director of the Arizona Health Sciences Library, University of Arizona in Tucson. She was formerly the Director of Columbia University's Health Sciences Library where she was co-principal investigator of Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center's Integrated Academic Information Management System (IAIMS) project. Her 1989 lecture, "Reinventing the Medical Librarian" (published 1989 in *Bulletin of the Medical Library Association*, 77[October], 323-331 and reprinted in *Library Lit: The Best of 1989*) explored recruitment and attributes of librarians critical for restructuring the profession to meet current and future needs. She is currently a member of the National Library of Medicine's Board of Regents.

Her research focuses on the effect of technological change on the nature and structure of work.
