**BLAISE CRONIN** has been Professor and Dean of the School of Library and Information Science, Indiana University, Bloomington, since 1991. From 1985 to 1991, he was Professor of Information Science and Head of the Department of Information Science in the Strathclyde Business School, University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, U.K. Dr. Cronin has authored/edited 200 books, reports, and articles. He has taught, done research, and consulted in thirty countries and is editor of the *Journal of Economic and Social Intelligence*.

**DOROTHY DAY** has an MA from the Graduate Library School at the University of Chicago. She is currently enrolled as a student in the Specialist Degree program at Indiana University's School of Library and Information Science and holds a part-time position with University Computing Services.
