Papers must represent original work. Extensive updates of previously published papers are acceptable, but revisions or adaptations of published work are not sought.

An issue editor proposes the theme and scope of a new issue, draws up a list of prospective authors and article topics, and provides short annotations of the article's scope or else gives a statement of philosophy guiding the issue's development.
